



Diprolene[®]/ Diprolene[®] AF (augmented betamethasone dipropionate) – New warning

- The [FDA approved](#) an update to the *Warnings and Precautions* section of the [Diprolene \(augmented betamethasone dipropionate\) ointment](#), [Diprolene AF cream](#) and [Diprolene lotion](#) drug labels regarding visual disturbance.
- Diprolene is a corticosteroid indicated for the relief of the inflammatory and pruritic manifestations of corticosteroid-responsive dermatoses in patients ≥ 13 years of age.
- Use of topical corticosteroids, including Diprolene and Diprolene AF, may increase the risk of posterior subcapsular cataracts and glaucoma. Cataracts and glaucoma have been reported postmarketing with the use of topical corticosteroid products, including Diprolene and Diprolene AF.
- Avoid contact of Diprolene and Diprolene AF with eyes. Patients should be advised to report any visual symptoms and consider referral to an ophthalmologist for evaluation.



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
